Walter J. Harrington, a native San Franciscan, passed away peacefully in San Francisco.

Walter began his building and real estate development profession while in his early 20's. Walt was one of the pioneering developers of apartment projects in Foster City. He established a partnership with the late Alexander Kulakoff in the 1970's. Together,Walt and Alex co-developed the eight story Casa Olga, an intermediate care facility in Palo Alto. Now, the site is home to the newly opened Epiphany Hotel. Walt and Alex developed Two Worlds ( Mountain View and Pleasant Hill ) which was modeled after the European Concept of integrating retail shops, business offices and residential units within one property site. The Urban Land Institute referred to Two Worlds as "a successful and innovative example of suburban mixed use." Harrington developed Santa Cruz Plaza in Menlo Park which serves as the cornerstone to the downtown business district.
