# Message from Rev. Jim Hagan, Rhet '63

Our esteemed alum, Fr. Jim Hagan, was released many years ago by the Archbishop to minister along the California-Mexican boarder. In 2023 the Alumni Association was able to honor him with an Alumnus of. The Year Award, and Jim also gave the homily at the Mass on that occasion. Jim periodically writes the Alumni Board to update his life and activities. His activities are unique: he not only ministers to the poor but particularly to those with handicaps, some quite severe. Jim is now fighting cancer. There follows a couple of excerpts from Jim's latest letter to us all.

"Our Chapel holds 200 with zero outside interest. Our children have long ago been cut off from public concern. In the words of a professor at the school of physical therapy where we sent our Directress to earn her certification, "the best course for these children is abortion." I choose to be here, to share with this people who love one another and evidence the eternal quest to live in peace.

I profess thanks for 40 plus years down here blessed with what my Mother called a strong back and a weak mind. Up until the beginning of December, I worked along with our crew swinging the pick and shoveling hard pan for a new septic system for our center of cognitive and speech therapy. I was diagnosed with stage IV prostate cancer that had spread to the spinal column. What distressed me was the oncologist's order to throw away my shovel and not lift anything heavy. After 20 years of taking care of David [read: "carrying" David], a man with cerebral palsy confined to a wheelchair, I had to send him to our home for men in Rosarita, the most painful decision of my life. What remains is an empty room and a larger void in my heart.

I do not not know how long or in what capacity I can continue. What I do know for sure is to give thanks to God for your support. With neither fear nor compromise, we can continue to work in the service of the other by the grace upon grace of the One who has joined us together.

#### **ALUMNI DAY 2025: A REPORT**

On April 26, 2025, we held our 43rd consecutive Alumni Day at St. Patrick's. Another successful event. If you missed it, hopefully you can make #44. The Alumni Association honored two alums with Alumnus of the Year Awards: Dan Collins (R'54) and Dennis Lucey (R'64). Dan is one of the longest serving members of the Alumni Board. A retired stockbroker, Dan has advised on the investment of the funds of the C.W. Sweeney Scholarship Fund during the many years of its existence, and he continues to advise the Alumni Board as part of its stewardship of the Association's funds. Dennis has for several years maintained and curated that weekly channel of communication known as "Semnet" which provides news and opinion to over 450 alums who have chosen to receive it. Dennis is a form of glue for us all.

This year the Alumni Board chose to award the James P. Murphy Award (for outstanding service to the Association itself) to Mark Wandro (C'70). A long-time member of the Board until very recently, Mark has continued to maintain our database to keep it "evergreen" so that we can stay connected. The principal celebrant at our Mass was Fr. Joe Gordon (R'65), a veteran member of the Board who was a member of the 60 year honoree class. The homily was delivered by Fr. Paul Rossi of the College class of 1970, a member of the 55 year honoree class. Fr. Paul's homily surely showed how much effort he put into saying something nostalgic and yet spiritually meaningful to this rather "unique" crowd. He recounted how he

and others joined their seminary classes only after high school, a transition that was hard but was made successful "under the wise and courageous leadership and guidance of the Sulpician priests, especially Al Giaquinto." Paul can still recall, in some detail, the tensions in seminary life brought about by Vatican II. The changes were cheered by some and decried by others. "...we were not even sure... St. Patrick's was going to open for a new year because of the unresolved conflicts and disagreements between the Archbishop and faculty." Yet, the Holy Spirit prevailed: quoting Cardinal Bob McElroy (H'72), " the greatest gift from the Holy Spirit to the Church in the last 100 years was the Second Vatican Council."


Paul also noted that this Alumni Day was falling within the octave of Easter and this Jubilee Year of Hope; so, Paul asked alums and guests to enter "the mystery of the death and resurrection", treasuring our baptisms and our role as "disciples who are living in the Paschal Mystery of Jesus". The Day was a success. We had happy Raffle prize winners. (Thanks to you donors to the Raffle!) Above all, it is clear that the luncheon format, rather than a dinner format, is permanent.
